- Gain insight into the wide range of liver diseases leading to End-Stage of Liver Disease (ESLD).
- Outline the surgical and nursing management of patients undergoing liver surgery
- Utilise knowledge gained to identify and respond to complications of ESLD with evidence based nursing care, including patient care considerations related to psychosocial issues, carer burden and palliative care management.
- Gain an understanding of the pathophysiology and the specific disease management principles of hepatological disorders, such as: Hepatitis B & C, Drug-induced liver failure, Hepatocellular Carcinoma, and NAFLD/NASH
