This **Leadership** introduces nurses to the concept of how effective teams work. Nurses will reflect on how people behave in teams in different circumstances and consider how they can apply this understanding to their practice to promote team success and build positive culture. This program is designed to support nurses to explore working with others effectively.

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Learning objectives

After attending this program, the learner will:

- Demonstrate autonomy and support for others to achieve outcomes in the work place
- Identify the impacts of positive and negative workplace culture on an organisation and how this impacts on patient safety
- Apply leadership strategies to influence culture and changes in practice
- Consider techniques to effectively manage and influence quality of care
