



Palliative Care Introductory study day

This **Clinical** program provides staff with a basic understanding of the clinical assessment and management of patients with a wide variety of palliative care issues including terminal care.

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Clinical experts will present interactive sessions that will improve participants knowledge on how to support patients receiving palliative care and focus on nursing attitudes and self-awareness when faced with distressing situations.

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Learning objectives

After attending this program, the learner will:

- Develop new communication skills and confidence in exploring what palliative care is to patients and families
- Attain insight into their personal attitudes when caring for the dying
- Be able to recognise a patient approaching terminal care and advocate for commencement of the Care Plan for the Dying
- Advocate patients' needs to colleagues for action
