Learning objectives

After attending this program, the learner will:

- Describe the pathophysiology of strokes and the associated risk factors
- Differentiate the evidence based best practice treatments utilised for patients post stroke in the acute phase versus the rehabilitative phases
- Explain the roles of the multidisciplinary team in stroke rehabilitation and recovery
- Undertake accurate stroke assessments in the clinical setting in the stable patient and/or deteriorating patient
